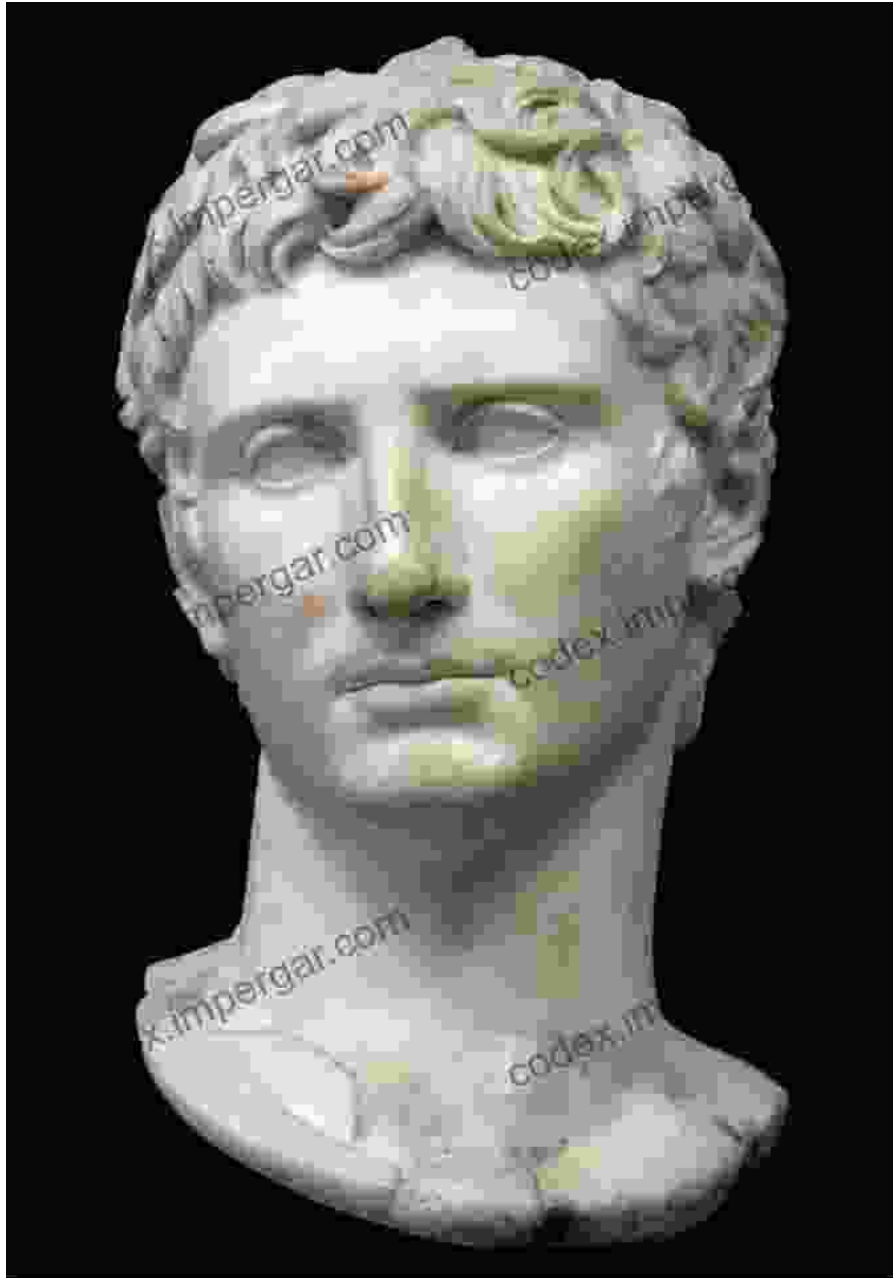

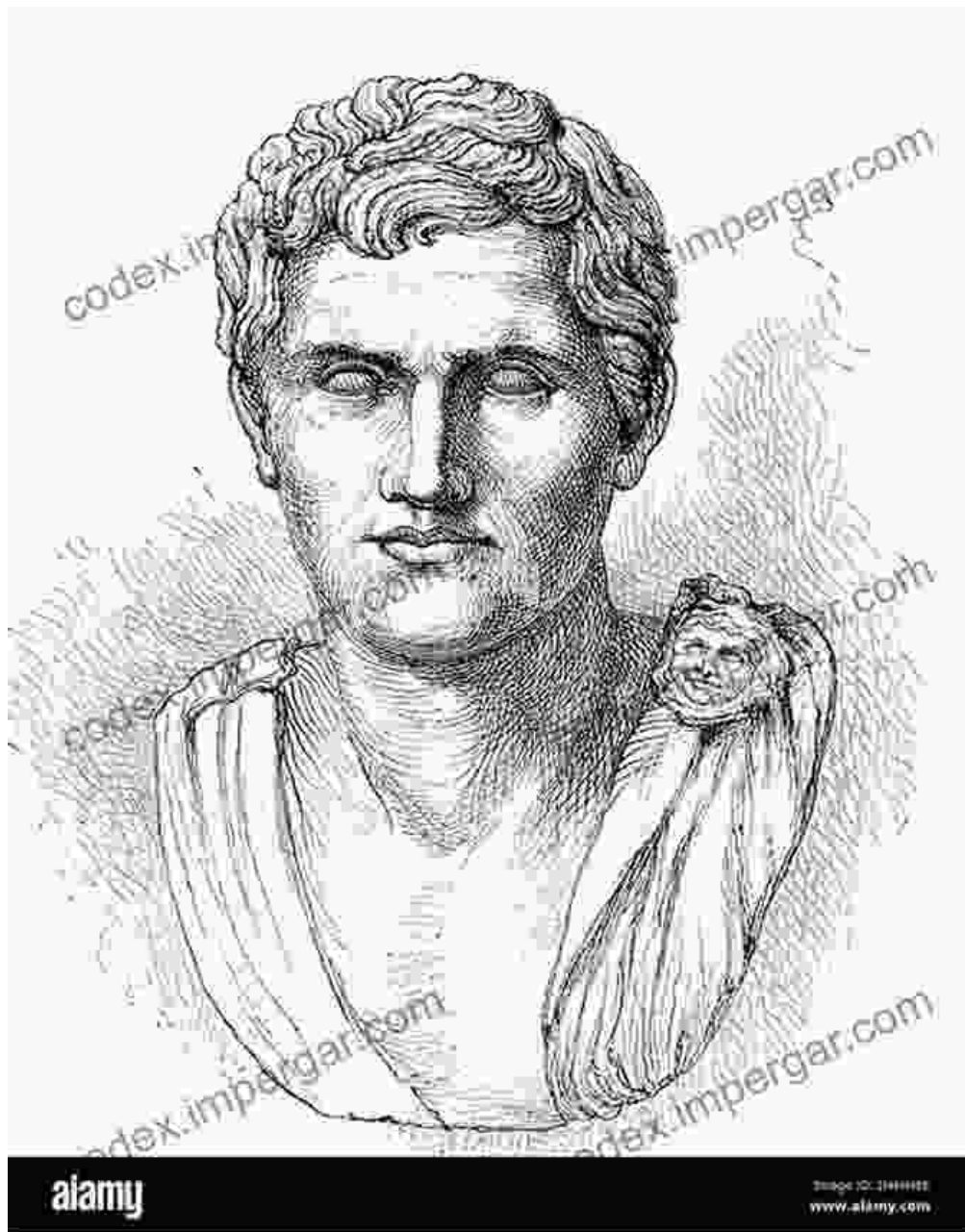

Pompey the Great



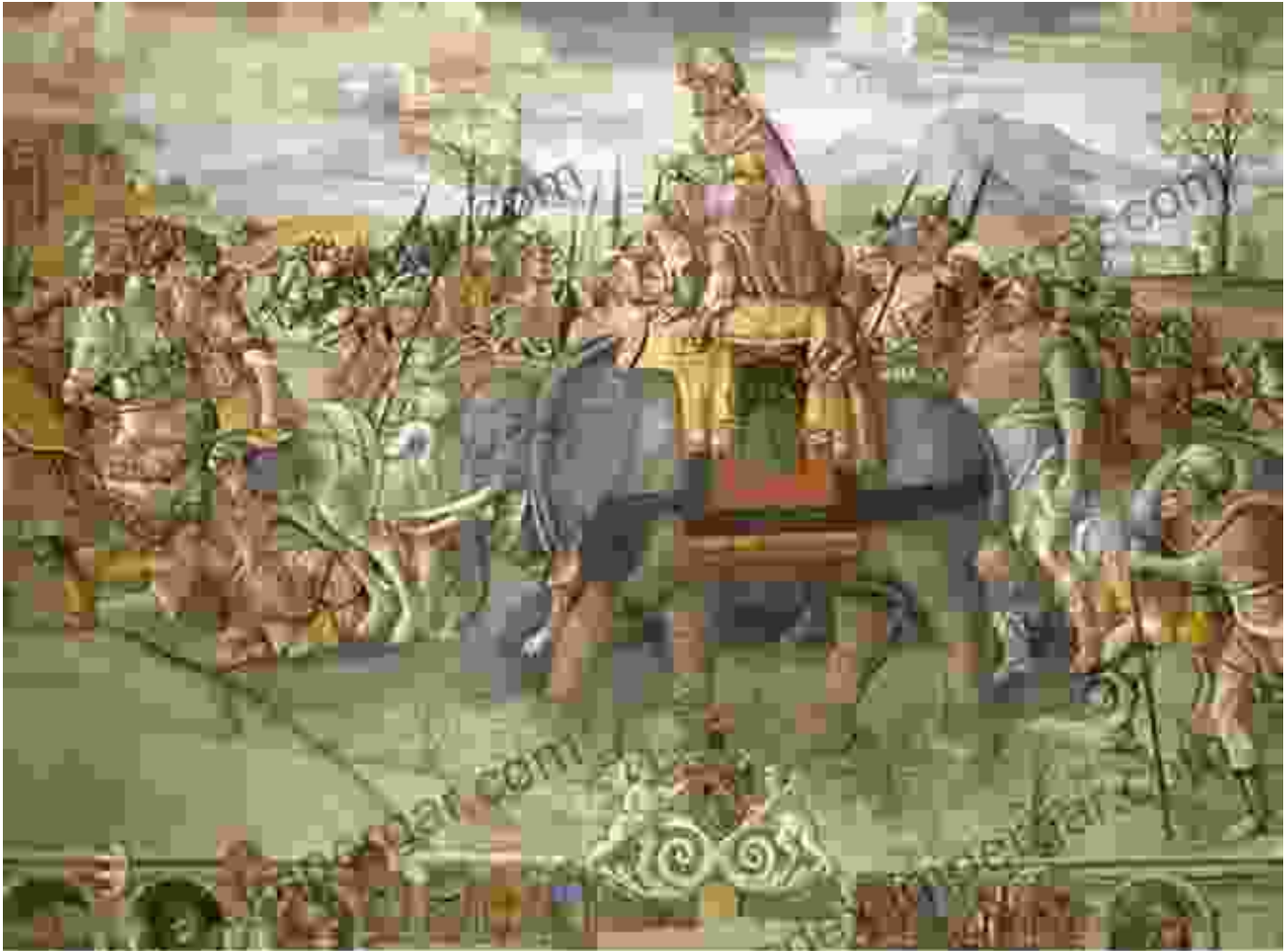

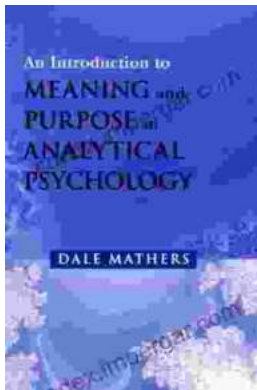
