



January 13, 2016, Vancouver, BC — Today the Vancouver Art Gallery announced a major donation of newly-discovered oil sketches by J.E.H. MacDonald (1873 – 1932)—iconoclast and founding member of the Group of Seven. Dusted in a backyard, hidden three decades—and forgotten by the public for nearly half a century—the collection of 10 oil sketches has been returned to the Canadian art world by donor collector Edith MacLennan Mervin. These works will be presented as part of a larger exhibition in the fall of 2016.

Estimated to be 100 years old, the sketches are considered valuable studies for MacDonald's most celebrated painted paintings, which are now part of important collections across Canada, including the National Gallery of Canada and Art Gallery of Ontario. The works include Sketch of Tangled Garden, 1910; Sketch of Circle by the Creek, 1918; Sketch of Park, Montreal River, 1920; Sketch of The Canoeists, 1920; Sketch of Leaves in the Brook, 1929; Sketch of Mist Fantasy, Northland, 1922; Sketch of The Blue River, 1930; and two other oil sketches, Sketch (Algoma), 1913 and Sketch (Balsamiana Forest), 1919 that do not relate to a known larger work.

Together these oil sketches provide a strong overview in both MacDonald's primary subject matter, depicting the life of the Canadian landscape—including gardens, rivers, rapids, forests—and his recurring style pose in and around the time of his involvement with the Group of Seven.

"We are delighted to have received these extraordinary paintings that are accompanied by such an incredible story," said Katherine S. Bailess, the Vancouver Art Gallery's Director. "We extend our sincere gratitude to the Mervin Family for this historical gift of generosity. This collection adds much depth to the existing works by MacDonald in our collection and reinforces the gallery's overall representation of the Group of Seven. It also sheds new light on some of the most famous and acclaimed MacDonald paintings that are in public collections around the country."




