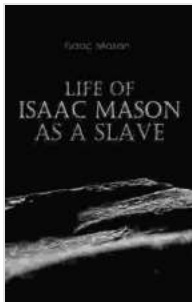

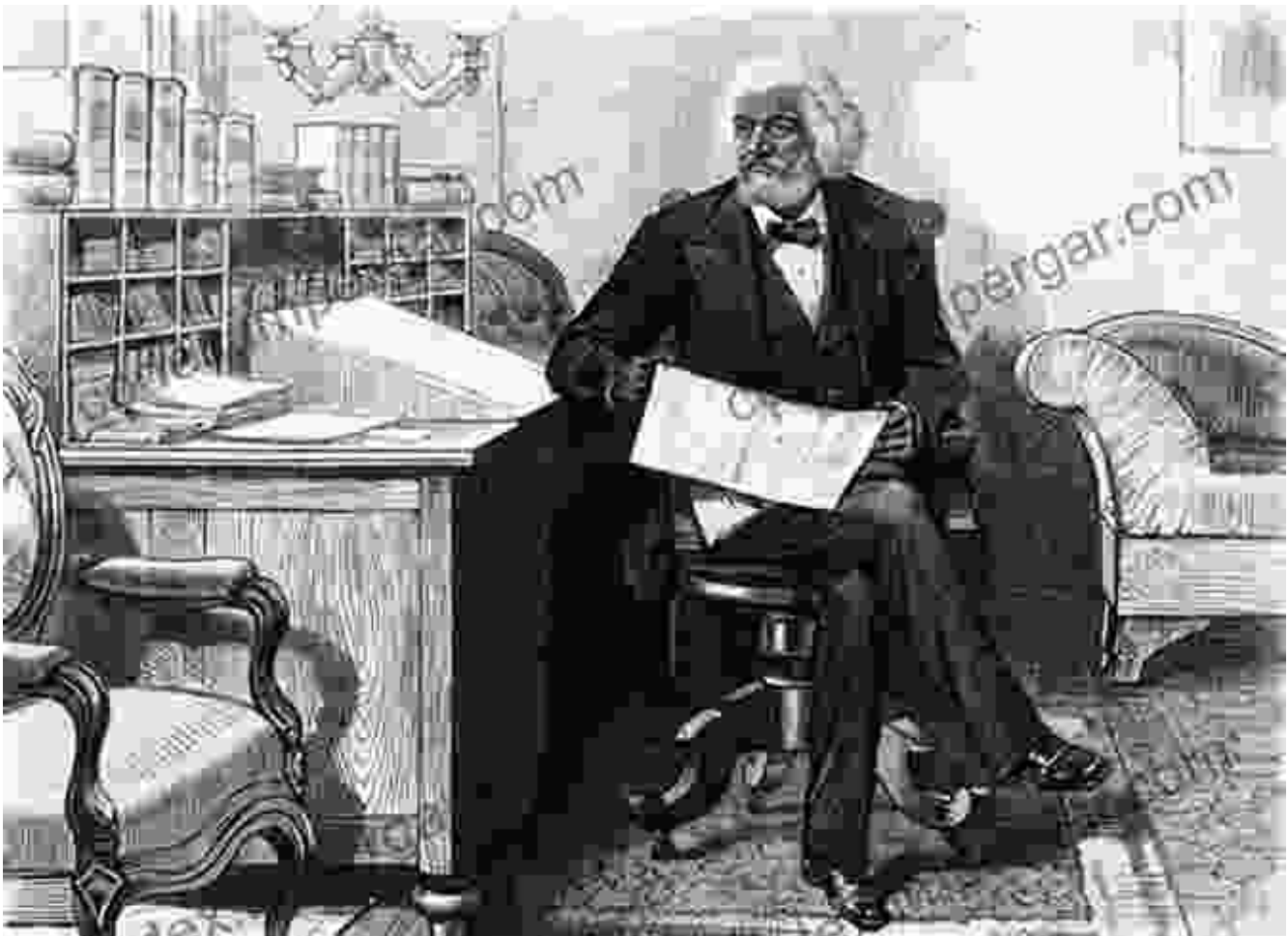

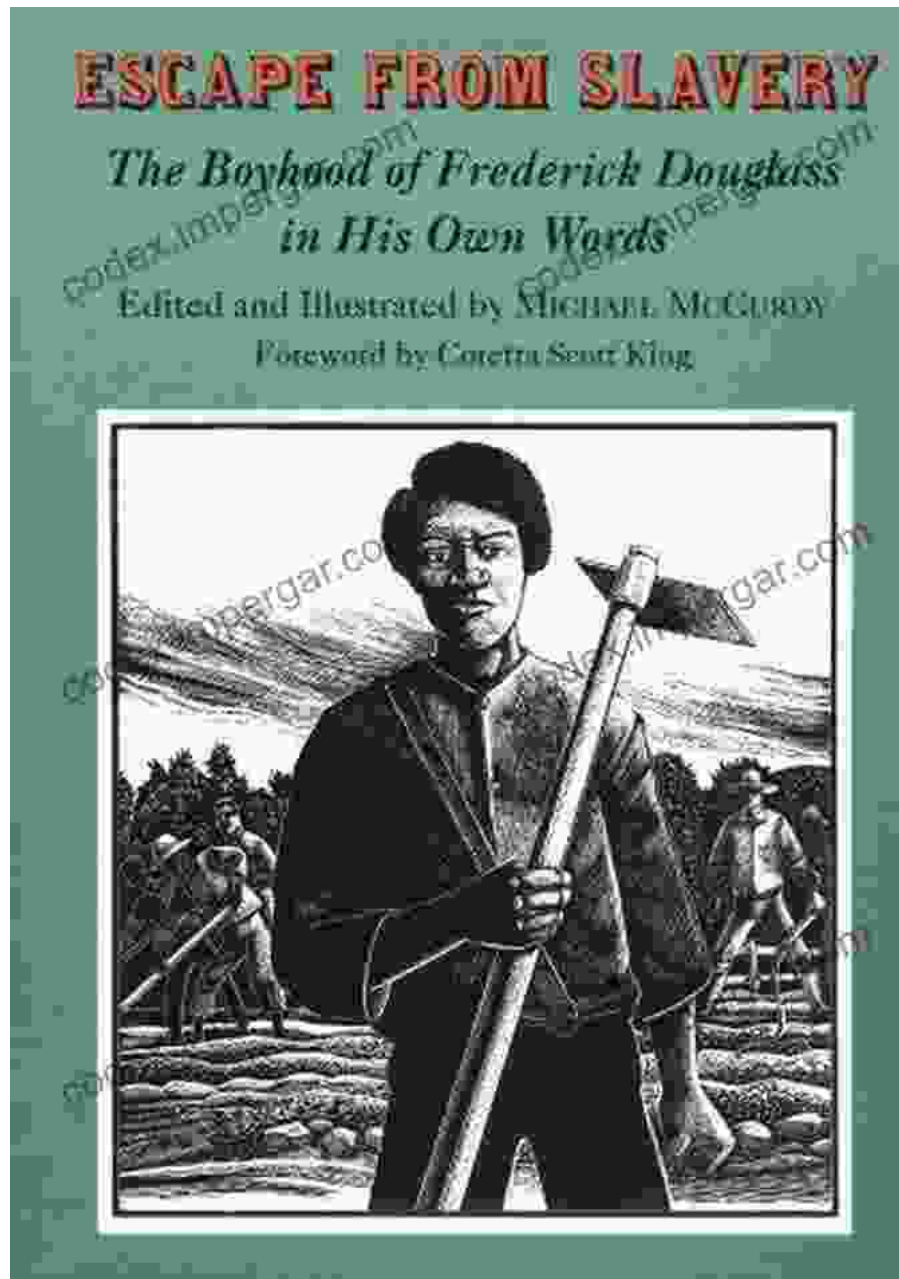
## **The Power of Literacy**

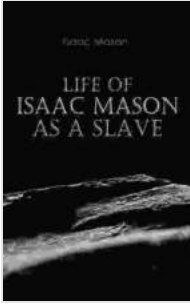

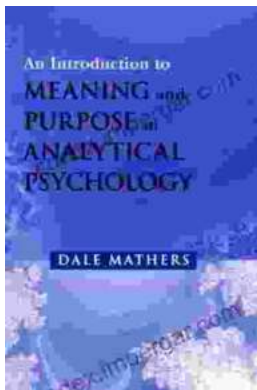

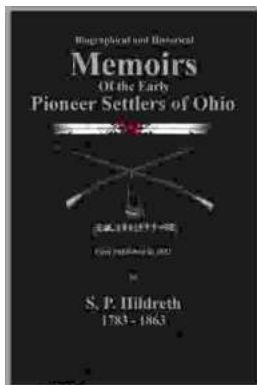
